Dear Mr. Zanders:

I wanted to take a minute to thank you for the donation that you made for the purchase of items for the displaced Veterans. Your generosity and that of many others allowed me to purchase and deliver the following:

22 clock radios	88 pairs of men's gloves	33 rubberized bath mats,
5 color televisions	5 sets of rabbit ears	24 desk lamps
9 irons	9 ironing boards	61 winter coats
420 undershirts	15 blankets	2 cases of toilet tissue
12 gallons of laundry detergent	10 women's winter hats	20 pairs of women's gloves

The total spent was \$4,150. During the last delivery that I made which included the winter coats, gloves and hats, I had the pleasure of meeting about a dozen of the Veterans who were displaced from Gulfport, Mississippi. When I delivered the coats, they were almost in tears as I am told they were only given an hour to pack up what they had and then move to their transport to be taken to Washington. Most of them did not even know where they were headed when they were transported to Washington, so they did not know what to pack. Many of the coats barely made it out of our van to a waiting rack as the Veterans who were volunteering to sort through the donated materials, who were also displaced from Mississippi, were taking them for themselves, immediately putting them on since it was a chilly weekend and were putting some aside for their friends who were also displaced. Many of them came up to me with their best wishes, thanks and a couple of "God Bless You" and I wanted to at least convey those to you as well since your kindness in helping made it all possible. I have spent all of the donated money and then some and will continue to support the Veterans as best I can but, should you wish to make any direct donations or speak with the woman in charge of the donations, her name is Melodie Menhe and she can be reached at 202/730-3401. I believe that the only thing that they are presently lacking are blankets for twin beds but their needs change on a daily basis.

Again, thank you for your support and I wish you the best in the coming holiday season.
